

WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO

The McLean Community Center (MCC) was built and is funded by residents of Greater McLean for their use through a real estate tax surcharge, the result of a 1970 bond referendum (Small District 1A-Dranesville).

Center facilities include the 383-seat Alden Theatre, the McLean Project for the Arts galleries, the Susan B. DuVal Art Studio, meeting and conference rooms, a rehearsal studio, a multipurpose classroom and catering kitchen.

Local open clubs and organizations use the center for their monthly meetings with a nominal charge. Center facilities may be rented for private functions such as business conferences, receptions, parties and recitals. District residents and businesses pay reduced fees. Registrations for McLean Youth Athletics and McLean Little League activities are regularly held at the center, and information on their activities is always available.

The center also operates the award-winning Old Firehouse Center, located at 1440 Chain Bridge Rd. in downtown McLean.

BOS APPOINTS NEW MEMBERS TO THE MCC GOVERNING BOARD

NEW OFFICERS ELECTED FOR FY2025

On Tuesday, May 21, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors appointed six new members to the McLean Community Center's (MCC) Governing Board. Residents of Dranesville Small District 1A, the new members won their seats by receiving the highest number of votes in the MCC's 2024 Governing Board Election.

The new adult members, Doug Jeffery, Michael Monroe and Peter Pin will serve three-year terms. Ron Keesing will serve a one-year, unexpired term. New teen members, Sonya Thott for the Langley High School Boundary Area and Aaron Stark for the McLean High School Boundary Area, will serve one-year terms.

At the first meeting of the new board on Wednesday, June 5, board officers were elected for the FY2025 budget year. Kristina Groennings was elected Board Chair, Anna Bartosiewicz, Vice-Chair, Michael Monroe, Secretary and Kathleen Cooney Porter, Treasurer.

MCC'S FY2026 BUDGET IS SUBJECT OF SEPTEMBER OPEN WORK SESSION AND PUBLIC HEARING

The McLean Community Center (MCC) Governing Board invites residents of Dranesville Small District 1A to attend two upcoming meetings held in-person and/or submit comments on the center's fiscal year 2026 budget, which begins July 1, 2025 and ends June 30, 2026. All meetings of the MCC Governing Board are open to the public. MCC is located at 1234 Ingleside Ave.


The first meeting, the **Finance Committee Meeting of the Whole**, will be held in-person at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 4. MCC Governing Board Treasurer Kathleen Cooney Porter and the full board will work on the FY26 budget. The departmental and consolidated budget proposals will include a review of FY2024 year-end actuals, the current year's budget (FY2025) and new proposals for FY2026.

Following this work session, the preliminary consolidated budget will be posted on the MCC website, mcleancenter.org, and will be available at the center a week prior to the public hearing.

The second meeting, the **Public Hearing on the FY2026 Budget** is at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 25 (convened in-person). This meeting will give residents a second opportunity to review and comment on the FY26 budget proposal. District residents who wish to speak at the public hearing are asked to call 703-790-0123, TTY: 711, to have their names placed on a speakers' list. In addition, written comments may be sent to the Governing Board by mail (address to: McLean Community Center, 1234 Ingleside Ave., McLean Va. 22101) or by email to **feedback@mcleancenter.org**.

District residents may continue to submit written comments after the public hearing through Monday, Oct. 21. The board will approve the FY2026 budget when it meets at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 23. The final budget will be approved by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors in spring 2025.

TWELVE YOUNG ARTISTS RECEIVE MACDONALD SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS


Twelve young local artists were awarded 2024 James C. Macdonald Performing Arts Scholarships by the McLean Community Center. The annual scholarship competition began with preliminary auditions in February and culminated with a final competition on stage at The Alden on Wednesday, April 17.

The James C. Macdonald Performing Arts Scholarship Competition encourages artistic achievement and promotes study in the arts by high school students who reside or attend school in the McLean district (Small Tax District 1A, Dranesville). Scholarship prizes of \$1,200 are awarded to students placing first in each of four categories: Dance, Instrumental Music, Theater and Vocal Music. Second-place winners are awarded \$800 and third-place winners win \$400. In 2020, the 1st place Instrumental Music Award was named in honor of Anita Lamkin, a longtime friend of young musicians and supporter of music performances in McLean.




